Farmers and ranchers throughout the West are finding it more and more difficult to make ends meet. Many farmers and ranchers in Idaho and elsewhere have made the decision to sell their property to developers. New housing developments can forever change the character of the area.

Yet studies have shown that wind turbines kill an average of only 1.4 birds per turbine per year (by comparison, US house cats are estimated to kill 26 birds per year in urban areas and 83 birds per year in rural areas – see www.owra.org/cateffect.htm).
